Audubon Lawsuit Seeks to Restore Protections for Migratory Birds

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service is moving to weaken the Endangered Species Act (ESA)—a law with a proven track record of success in protecting and recovering our most vulnerable birds and other wildlife. It has prevented 99 percent of the species under its care from going extinct, and recovered iconic birds such as the Peregrine Falcon and Bald Eagle. The ESA is a critical safety net and must remain strong to protect birds and other wildlife now and in the future
